## The Patrol Function of the Police

Police patrol gives the police a direct connection with the community because patrol officers have the greatest contact with the public. They can develop close connections with individual members of community, which can help improve the public's perception of the police. The trust that is also developed between the public and the patrol officer can be helpful for various future crime fighting efforts. A police officer is assigned a particular area, also called a beat, which is then patrolled twenty-four hours a day by different shifts. Historically, patrol has been done on foot, but over the years more patrol has been conducted in cars. But although patrol gives the police a close connection with a community, does increasing patrol really reduce crime? Are there different kinds of patrol, and if so, which one is most effective for reducing crime? The Kansas City Preventive Patrol Experiment in 1972 set out to answer these questions.
