Grammar Explanation

When to use a/an or no article

- The indefinite article has two forms: *a* and *an*. Use *an* only when the first word of a noun or noun phrase begins with a vowel sound (e.g., *an idea, an hour*).
- Use the indefinite article (a or an) with singular nouns that do not refer to someone or something specific.
 - o Example: Culture plays an important role in shaping a person.
- Do not use the indefinite article (a or an) before non-count or plural nouns.
 - o Incorrect: I researched an information about sugar consumption's effects on a children.
 - Corrected: I researched information about sugar consumption's effects on children.
