Grammar Explanation

Subject-Verb Agreement: Subject with several words

- A subject can be a single word or a phrase. A long noun phrase has a head subject, and a group of words that describe the head subject.
 - Example: The <u>statistics</u> <u>in Doctor Kenneth's controversial article</u> are inaccurate.

Note that the phrase *in Doctor Kenneth's controversial article* simply describes the head subject, which is *statistics*.

- The verb must agree with the head subject, not with another noun in the group of words that follow it.
 - o Incorrect: The <u>students</u> <u>who conducted the research with Professor</u> <u>Eliot was praised by the president.</u>
 - Corrected: The <u>students</u> <u>who conducted the research with Professor</u>
 <u>Eliot</u> were praised by the president.
